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


### A new living culture



  - services














### Fondazione Housing Sociale was born to answer to a need

- The economic crisis is leading people to find new ways to improve their condition, seeking **collaborative and sustainable solutions** that can guarantee a satisfactory quality of life: a new "culture of living" both private and public spaces is emerging
- Offering a house today means producing efficient buildings but also **making platforms** available that allow people to activate the resources needed to build a neighborhood and a community. Throughout Europe there is a shift from the supply of houses to the supply of housing services
- We could therefore define Social Housing as the set of dwellings, services and instruments addressed to those who are unable to meet their housing
  and related primary needs on the open market for economic reasons





# Social Housing is focusing on a weak part of the population

- €16.000 per family is the annual income index ("Isee-erp") allowing families to require a public house in Lombardy
- Appr. 50% of families living in the most recently completed social housing projects records an Isee-erp below €16.000
